SafeNest uses evidence-based metrics to measure our impact, including the Hope Score developed by the University of Oklahoma–Tulsa Hope Research Center. Hope is not abstract—it is measurable, actionable, and transformational. When hope rises, violence ends.

- A survivor filled with hope does not return to abuse.
- An abusive partner with hope does not continue to harm.

By elevating hope across children, survivors, and abusive partners, SafeNest moves beyond crisis response to lasting prevention. This is how we break the cycle of domestic and sexual violence—one Hope Score at a time.



